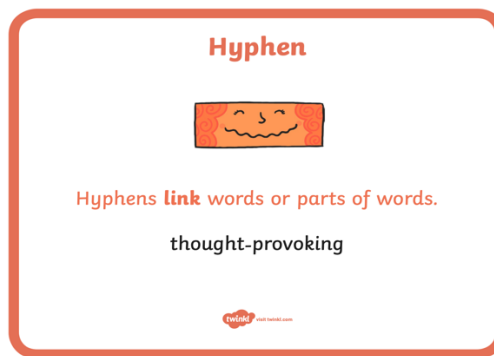
- Can you complete a Reading Challenge this week and add another leaf to your class tree?
